ENERGY RETROFIT & THIRD PARTY FINANCING

Third party financing schemes such as EPC (Energy Performance Contract) have grown in the recent years and get more attention since energy retrofit of the existing building stock will represent a major challenge. In Belgium, the federal energy services company, Fedesco, plays a leading role in developing the TPF model and practises in the public sector since its creation in 2005. In addition to its federal mission, Fedesco operates a National Competence Center aiming to transfer know how, tools and services to the regional and local public actors. ESCO companies remain also active in developing the market with the start of BELESCO, an industry association working on tools, models and best practices within the sector. Organised in partnership with Fedesco and Belesco during the next Energy Forum, this 2010 Public Sector Forum aims to give a complete overview of the market maturity, with a specific attention to the regions policies in third party financing initiatives and EPC development.

Speaker policy

Selection criteria

According to the vision of the program committee, papers will be scheduled as an

oral presentation or refused. Abstracts will be reviewed and judged on the basis of the following criteria:

- * Relevance to the conference theme and theme of the individual sessions
 - * Significance of the work/project to a broad audience
 - * Originality of work/project including new applications, innovations or data
 - * The completeness of the work/project
- Preference will be given to papers that have not been presented at other conferences. If your paper was previously presented, please mention where and when.

Submission stages

Your proposal will need to include:

- * Author's name and a bio information
- * Title of presentation (15 words max)
- * Summary of the presentation (around 200 words)
- * Include 3 learning objectives for your presentation, focusing on what knowledge attendees will gain from the presentation
- * Who your target audience is likely to be
- * Name and bio information of any co-speakers

Review process

All papers will be reviewed by the program committee. Applicants will be notified of their status by email. A paper application implies the author(s) acceptance to publish the paper in the conference proceedings (online).
